THE PEARCE PANILY GENEALOGY

The Pearce family came from Bourne, England. Richard Pearce met Susan Austen at a fair some 28 miles from Bourne, and a friendship grow between them which resulted in their marriage in the year 1813. Sarah, Richard's twin sister, met Charles Austen attthis same fair; both couples were married at the same time in Marybone Church, which was called the queen's church. Royalty attended their wedding.

After their wedding, they went to their husbands' homes, where they stayed eight days, then packed all their belongings. Susan Pearce had two eight-horse wagon loads of household goods, and Sarah and Charles Austen had the same amount. They arranged to meet on a certain long bridge that crossed the river which ran mear Bourne. When they met, all the teams were stopped and a great time was held. Richard and Susan Pearce took lodgings in London, while Sarah and Charles Austen went to Castle Gate Manor.

Susan Pearce and Sarah Austen were left at their homes while Richard Pearce and Charles Austen came to America to find homes for them here. They were four weeks crossing in a sailing vessel. They landed in New York in the year 1820. They took a stage for Philadelphia and Pittsburgh. They became acquainted with a Mr. Robert Davis, whose brother-in-law William Cochran, had charge of 400 acres of land which the government owned on Pine Creek, twelve miles from Pittsburgh on the Butler Turn-pike road. William Cochran offered to sell them land at fifty cents per acre.

They each bought fifty acres. The Austen land was on the west side, and the Pearce property was on the east side of Pine Creek. There was an old log cabin and a mill site on the Pearce property, so Richard Pearce chose the section he did because he was a miller. He began at once to repare the mill, mill-dam, and mill race course,

The Austen property boasted me buildings at all, but was fine pasture land for cattle and sheep. Mr. Austen cut timber for a house. In the fall of 1820, Susan Pearce and Sarah Austen disposed of all their property in England. They started for America on the tenth of March, 1821. They sailed from the London docks; they were nine weeks on the ocean and had a very rough voyage. They ran out of provisions, and

were in a storm off the Bay of Biscay; they landed in New York the last of April, 1821, and were met by their husbands, Richard Pearce and Charles Austen. The two families took a stage coach to Philadelphia and there Richard Pearce purchased a team of horses and allight wagon and set out ahead. In two weeks time, the Austen family had bought a team of horses, and a Mr. Teegod and family bought the wagon. They put all their goods in the wagon and started for Pittsburgh; they were one month on the way. They arrived in Pittsubrgh in June, 1821. They went to Pine Creek, and found things as they had left them.

Meither Richard Pearce nor Charles Austen had ever done much laboring work in England, and both found it hard work to farm. They were very much discouraged, and were on the point of going back to England several times. Both lived to a good old age, and are buried in the old grave yard at the Cross Roads Presbyterian Church.

Charles Pearce was the youngest of the Richard Pearce family, and was married to Permelia Nelson, April 21, 1859. Nine children survived Mr. and Mrs. Charles Pearce, five sons: Albert, Edwin, Wesley, Wilbur, and Clarence, and four daughters: Mrs. Melia McKelvey, Mrs. Adds Neely, Mrs. Lee Grubbs, and Mrs. Charles Anderson.

Albert A. Pearce, the eldest son of Charles Pearce, was married to Annie Umstead on May 10, 1883. Annie and Albert Pearce lived several places before settling down in their present home at McKaystore, Ohio, where they operate a general merchandise store. Russel Pearce is in the same business. Loyal Pearce runs a farm just a few miles from his father's store. Charles Pearce is in Dormont, where he is making and selling candy, while Bertha is married to Reverend Harold Lees, who is in charge of a church at Newcomerstown, Ohio.

Albert Pearce was 75 years old in 1935 and received a birthday card shower.

He has been married 52 years and has lived happily with Annie Umstead.

Permelia A. Pearce, the second child of Charles Pearce, was married to D.D. McKelvey on March 31, 1881. They lived on a family near Bakerstown Station until D.D. McKelvey's death in 1929. From that time on, she has made her home with her daughter, Minnie E. McKelvey of Butler, who married Urban Andre. The has a retail

tea and coffee shop at 106 Summit Street, Butler. Charles McKelvey, the eldest son of Melia McKelvey, is married to Elsie Greer, and now resides at Valencia. Charles is a successful carpenter by trade. Harry McKelvey is the second child of Melia McKelvey, and is employed by the Kopperus Company of Fittsburgh. He was married to Ada Kennedy, who was in the insurance business, on July 7, 1912. They have 3 daughters, one Elva, married to Enos Emery, the only one of the fifth generation who is married. Margaret is attending Slippery Hock State Mormal, preparing to be a teacher. The youngest daughter Helen, is attending high school. The only child of Minnie Andre, David Andre, is a student in the Butler Business College at Butler, Pennsylvania.

Ada Pearce, the third living child, was born Movember 26, 1866, and was married to Albion S. Meely, December 25, 1889. They were living at their present residence when Mr. Neely died on June 1, 1920. Albion Neely was a farmer, and he and his wife had four children. Charley, who was married to Blanche Bowers, now resides at Grove City. They have four children: Louella, who is attending Slippery Rock State Normal; Eliasbeth, a junior in high school; and Calvin and Burleigh, who are going to grade school. The second son Bert Neely, was married to Frances Williams and has six children: Dorothy, Clarence, Margaret, Wesley, Wilbur, and Myrtle; all of them except Myrtle are attending grade school. The third son Floyd is married to Fanny Wile, and lives near the family homestead. They have four children: Jean and Lewis, who are students in the Warrendale school, and Elmer and Ruth Romaine, who are at home with their mother. The only daughter Alice Neely, was married to Harry George on March 5, 1935 and now lives at home. Harry is a bricklayer.

Edwin Pearce was married to Maud V. McCawley on January 17, 1898 and now lives in Valencia. He is working in the Allegheny County Horth Park. His eldest living daughter Bessie, is working at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Boyle of Bakerstown. His eldest son Albert, is successfully running a bread route for the Pittsburgh Maid Bread Company, and also lives in Valencia. Albert is married to Margaret Wilson, and has three children: Dorothy, Edwin, and Raymond; they are attending the George Washington school at Bakerstown. The youngest son of Edwin Pearce, Glenn, is working

at the Mueller Farms at Bakerstown.

Minnie A. Pearce was married to Lee Grubbs, June 26, 1895, and now resides at the Grubbs homestead, Wexford, Pa.. They have nine children. Nettie P. was married to Carl Rummel and lives at the upper corner of the Grubbs farm. Wilson, married March 15, 1930 to Dorothy Weight, lives in the front part of the family homestead, and has one son Norman, born October 7, 1930. Eliasbeth H. was married to William Gibson March 16, 1927, and resides near Plains Church. She has one daughter Hasel, born May 15, 1930. Olive A., married to Arthur Harbuschen, has one daughter Ellen, born September 27, 1930. They live at the upper corner of the Grubbs homestead. Pearl, Earl, Ethel, and Lyan reside at home. Edna, married to Charles Harbush, now lives at West View.

Wesley H. Pearce was married to Bessie Hill, May 28, 1910. He owns a farm in Butler County about four miles from Mars on the Three Degree Road.
