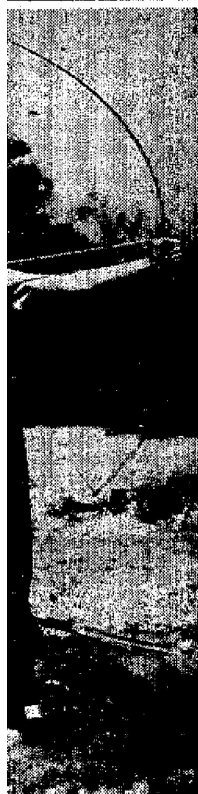

**ROBIN HOODS, JUNIOR GRADE**—A completely equipped junior range with special targets and distance markings is provided for the children of club members. The small fry, using lighter bows, usually shoot from 25 yards. All shooting on the junior range is done under supervision, as even arrows without hunting tips are dangerous. Adults are always on hand to instruct the children, who absorb an amazing amount of archery knowledge as they watch adult meets.
